HEALTH AND WELLBEING

We are very aware of the importance of developing positive mental health for our pupils. During Term 1 we have already begun several initiatives to focus on Pupil Health and Wellbeing. As well as our daily mile each morning and our monthly Walk to School, we have also welcomed



Action Mental Health into school as well as the **EA Reach Programme**. By the end of Term 2, each class will have participated in Action Mental Health 'Healthy Me' Programme.

Healthy Me promotes good mental health and social and emotional well-being in children with a strong focus on prevention and self-care.

Our P4, 5 and 6 classes are also working with staff from the Education Authority 'Reach' Programme. This is an engaging programme for pupils to help them explore feelings and emotions, managing worries, strengths, kindness, gratitude and self-care.

The P3 Class are currently taking part in the **Roots of Empathy** Programme. The program consists of guided observations of an infant's development and emotions by school children. It supports childrens' positive mental health and wellbeing. We are so lucky to have Baby John-Joe visit the class once a month and over the course of year we will watch baby John Joe grow and develop.

We will also be partaking in **Anti-Bullying** activities next week and have signed up to work with NSPCC on their **Speak Out Stay Safe** campaign next term. Teachers also continue to make **Personal Development and Mutual Understanding**and **Pupil Wellbeing** a key element to ongoing classroom practice, through **Circle Time**, focused lessons and active
learning. Please remember our door is always open if you need to discuss any aspects of your childs over all wellbeing.

DEFIBRILLATOR

We are pleased to announce that we have purchased a defibrillator for the school. This was partially funded by our Cash For Clobber initiative that raised over £300.
